

## **UAS Juneau Campus Safety Committee Minutes**

### **Recent Incident Reports**

Only one OSHA reportable injury occurred since the last meeting. A Residential Assistant cut his finger on a glass bottle and required stitches. There were two strains reported, one knee and one ankle.

### **Fire Drills**

Evacuation plans are being updated to reflect changes in our campus configuration and assembly points in preparation to conduct fire drills.

### **Small Boat Safety Manual**

EHS is in the process of revising the UAF manual to meet UAS needs. All faculty and staff that use small boats have been identified and will be involved in the review and approval of the revised manual.

### **Emergency Management Planner Orientation**

Matthew Ziemer is currently in Sitka working with staff to produce an After Action Report following the office fire that occurred on March 24, 2016. He gave a summary of his orientation activities including meeting the local first responders, reviewing existing plans and generally getting an understanding of how the university functions.

### **Alaska Shield 2016**

Matthew Ziemer travelled to Anchorage on April 1 to participate in UAA's full scale exercise. The UAA team, working with local training partners simulated an active shooter incident and an explosion. Matthew played the role of an evaluator in the EOC.

### **Campus Safety Committee / Safety and Emergency Management Coordinating Committee**

The local Safety Committee involves local campus participation and issues and serves as a resource to the UAS Emergency Management Planner to provide input on emergency programs. The Coordinating Committee is more strategic in nature and includes representation from all three UAS campuses. This relationship is developing.

### **Firearms**

SB 174 has passed out of committee and is expected on the Senate floor in the near future. Brief discussion of the status of the UA proposed amendments.

### **Minors on Campus Regulation**

UAS staff and faculty have provided comments on the proposed regulations addressing minors on campus and their participation in UA programs and activities. Comments include the need for clarity of direction for both UA employees and the general public who hold events at UA facilities. Right now the regulations are complicated and take a lot of effort to find out what you have to do to be in compliance.
