40-Hour Hazardous Waste Operations

This course is called Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response. It's also known as Hazardous Waste Site Worker. The curriculum, outlined and required under 29 CFR 1910.120, consists of these topics: Rights and Legal Responsibilities, Hazard Recognition, Health and Safety Hazards, Hazard Control, Selection and use of Proper Personal Protective Equipment, Work Practices, Medical Surveillance, Environmental Monitoring, Decontamination, Drum and Container Handling, and Emergency Response to Hazardous Materials Situations. This course has become a standard for minimum hazardous materials safety training.

After completing this course, the student will be better able to recognize chemical and other safety hazards at a work site, minimize contact with hazardous substances, and use protective equipment and understand the need for site-specific training.

Persons interested in this course work in the following fields: Anyone who is required to work with or around hazardous materials and the potential of a spill incident can occur. **Work positions** in Alaska include: Construction, or related work on military installations; Railroad work; maritime work; Environmental clean-up projects; Oil/fuel spill response; Underground fuel storage tank removal or maintenance; Airport maintenance. HAZWOPER certificates of training and wallet cards are provided to students who successfully complete the course. To remain current with this training, an annual one-day refresher class prior to the anniversary of the expiration date is required.

8-Hour HAZWOPER Annual Renewal

This course is for persons who desire to keep current on the HAZWOPER certification. They must take this refresher course within 12 months of the expiration date of the HAZWOPER 40-Hour Course or their last Refresher Course. Employers

will require a current certificate of attendance. It will review the subject matter above as it relates to 29 CFR 1910.120. **Note: Students must**

show the instructor documentation of the HAZWOPER 40-Hour certification and the most current annual 8-Hour recertification (if applicable).

HAZWOPER Certificates of Training and wallet cards will be issued to all students who successfully complete the course. These are valid for one year.
