UA Online has been upgraded to accept a username and password (rather than Employee Number and PIN) as of today. This allows for a much more streamlined process for students and faculty.

Blackboard upgrade: A test version of the new Blackboard environment is being provided. This version of Blackboard classes is being made available as a test environment for anyone who wishes to pilot the system prior to the live upgrade in Spring. IT is working on a manual solution course copies in this environment which includes grouping classes and copying them as a batch. An announcement will be sent this week which will inform us of the readiness of this test environment. In addition, in the new version of Bb there is an option to allow the course to keep the same "look and feel" as the previous version. This should assist in the transition to the new version.

Objectives of the QM Focus Group:

1. Explore QM rubric as well as other rubrics for course design and applications for these rubrics
2. As a focus group, develop recommendations about the value of course design rubrics in the UAS environment
3. Recommend next steps for using QM rubric or QM-type rubric at UAS

The Regional TLTR recommends that the focus group report final recommendations some time prior to the first of May. The Focus Group Chair (Anne Jones) will provide updates to the Regional TLTR during each meeting - she will be added to the standing agenda.

Discussion focused around accessibility for all users, impact of support on IT and student learning, and the role of the committee in this issue.

Tony will talk with Michael Ciri about this memo, and determine who should be invited to the next meeting so that the committee has the most appropriate information in order to make a recommendation.
